## Services Provided through the Early Childhood Development Program

- **Developmental Evaluation:**  
To assess your child's developmental strengths and challenges.
- **Speech Language Therapy:**  
To address your child's communication needs.
- **Occupational Therapy:**  
To support your child's self help and regulation skills.
- **Physical Therapy:**  
To promote your child's mobility, balance and coordination skills.
- **Special Instruction:**  
To assist with your child's behavior, thinking and self help skills.
- **Care Coordination:**  
To oversee your child's individualized services.
